VOTE

IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL ELECTION

LA's 99 Neighborhood Councils (NC) form the grassroots level of the Los Angeles City government. NCs advocate on issues like homelessness, housing, public safety, parks, and sustainability.

The City Clerk is conducting up to 96 NC Elections citywide to elect their board members.

If you live, work, own a business, own real property, or have an interest in the community, you are a stakeholder and can vote in NC elections!

Due to COVID-19, the 2021 NC Elections are being conducted entirely by mail. Voters must submit a Vote-By-Mail (VBM) Application to prove they are a stakeholder in the NC to receive a ballot.

Participating in NC Elections is easy!

* Some NCs require documentation to establish stakeholder status before receiving a ballot. See this document to identify if your NC requires documentation.

** VBM Applications or required documentation must be submitted no later than 5:00 p.m. on filing deadline days.
